It is part of the Nova Scotia Museum, operated locally by the Nova Scotia Highland Village Society. Each year, museum visitors come to Highland Village to experience the language, culture, and history of Nova Scotia Gaels, through first person (role playing) animation, storytelling tours, special programs, workshops, hands-on activities, and outreach.

The Highland Village is seeking an individual to join its front line team in both visitor services and animation:

NEACH-BEÒTHACHAIDH/NEACH-CLÉIREACH | ANIMATOR/VISITOR CENTRE CLERK (PERMANENT) - The Animator/Visitor Centre Clerk, in costume, provides informative, effective and entertaining interpretation of Nova Scotia's Gaelic heritage and culture through first person (role playing) interpretation; demonstrations of language, culture, crafts, and folklife; and participation in "living history" and cultural and interpretive programming. The Animator also cares for the objects and buildings assigned to them. The Animator/Visitor Centre Clerk will also be trained to work at the front desk for visitor reception, orientation and gift shop sales.

Applicants must:

- Have the ability to explain relevant content in a clear and entertaining way;
- Be comfortable speaking in front of groups and interacting with people of all ages and backgrounds;
- Have general knowledge of the Gaelic Nova Scotia story and identity;
- Be able to handle money and process sales;
- Have demonstrated interpersonal skills and is good team player;
- Give and take feedback constructively;
- Have strong communication skills (both oral and written);
- Be friendly, courteous with an outgoing personality.
- Language, cultural and heritage skills are assets.

The work term is full-time seasonal (35-40 hours/week, September & October 2022 and June to October 2023). The starting wage is \$15/hr.
