Baile nan Gàidheal | Highland Village is Nova Scotia's Provincial museum and folk life centre for Gaelic language and culture. Each year, Nova Scotians, and visitors to Nova Scotia, engage with the Highland Village for transmission and experiential presentation of Nova Scotia Gaelic culture and language, by way of first person (role playing) animation, special programs, workshops, hands-on activities, and outreach. The Highland Village is seeking an individual to help lead its agricultural program as Farmer.

Duties: Reporting to the Manager of Facilities & Grounds and the Manager of Visitor Engagement, the Farmer (in costume) is responsible for the development, implementation, and coordination of the Highland Village farm program, including animal care, garden care, farm presentation, visitor experiences and partnership development.

The Farmer is responsible for the care of the animals, gardens, objects, and buildings that are part of the farm program.

The Farmer provides accurate, informative, effective and entertaining interpretation of Nova Scotia's Gaelic heritage and culture, in particular farming and agricultural practices, through first person (role playing) interpretation; demonstrates the language, culture, crafts, and folklife; and participates in "living history," cultural and interpretive programming.

Qualifications: Demonstrated experience in the care and handling of livestock; experience planning and caring for gardens; ability to coordinate human and material resources to ensure animals and gardens are cared for; successful completion of high school or relevant life experience; can problem solve and quickly adapt to changing situations; has an ability to explain things in a clear and entertaining way and through first person animation; ability to research and develop first person characters (personas & related stories); comfortable speaking in front of groups and interacting with people of all ages and backgrounds; knowledge of local, Nova Scotian, and Canadian history; demonstrated strength in the area of interpersonal skill and teamwork; gives and takes constructive feedback; strong communication skills, both verbal and written; demonstrated ability to interact well with people with tact, listening skills, and positive attitude; friendly, courteous and outgoing personality; knowledge or interest in Gaelic language, culture and history; valid driver's license; basic computer skills, i.e. word processing, e-mail, internet, etc.; cultural and folklife skills are assets (e.g. Gaelic singing, fiddle playing, spinning, weaving, cooking, etc.).

Terms of position: This is a full-time, seasonal position (40 hours/week, mid-April to October) for the 2024 season, with potential for renewal. Wage scale is \$22.20 - \$25.85 per hour – compensation dependent on successful candidate's experience. Group benefit package available.
